PROJECT GRANTS FUNDED

Amerind Foundation, DRAGOON. *Interwoven Traditions: The Cultural Legacy of Southwestern Textiles.* AHC funds will support "Interwoven Traditions: The Cultural Legacy of Southwestern Textiles," an exhibit and public program series opening in October 2011 exploring the interconnections among Native American Pueblo, Diné, and Spanish-colonial communities through the lens of textile design, technology, and the economics of weaving. \$5,000

Arizona Archaeological Society, Northern Arizona Chapter, FLAGSTAFF.

Hohokam Archaeology: Yesterday and Today on YouTube. AHC will support the production of a digital video of the July 2011 Archaeological Month symposium "Hohokam Archaeology Yesterday and Today," capturing the highlights of the symposium for teachers, students, archaeology and history professionals, and the general public. \$1,732



Arizona Historical Society, Southern AZ Division, TUCSON. *100 Years, 100 Quilts, 100 Days.* A traveling exhibit available to small and/or rural communities across Arizona, and incorporating the works of contemporary quiltmakers and their stories, The exhibit is part of a larger Centennial collaboration, and will be supplemented by a virtual tour of all 100 quilts, together with interviews, which will be posted on AHS's website in 2012. \$10,000

Arizona State Parks, PHOENIX. *Homolo'vi Ruins State Park Grand Opening.* AHC funds will support programming at the park's reopening on March 18, 2011 and will feature presentations from native scholars and traditional teachers. \$7,250

ASU, Department of History, TEMPE. *The Pride: Making History Every Day.* A pilot project between ASU's Public History program and Red Mountain High School, Mesa, resulting in oral history workshops and a public exhibit on the history of the surrounding community created by RMHS students. \$5,000

ASU, Morrison Institute for Public Policy, PHOENIX. *Arizona's Constitution and Our Political Culture: The Progressive Roots.* A public panel discussion exploring the ideas behind the framing of Arizona's constitution and the political and policy relevance today. The panel, which will be held in April 2012 at the AHS Museum in Tempe, will include historians, political scientists, and legal scholars, and will be moderated by ASU's Morrison Institute for Public Policy. \$5,000

Arizona Women's Heritage Trail, RIO VERDE. *AWHT Women's Suffrage Centennial Public Forums.* Five public forums reenacting the historical women's suffrage debates in Arizona in the early 20th century. Forums will be held in Yuma, Prescott, Tucson, and Phoenix, and will be moderated by humanities scholars. \$10,000



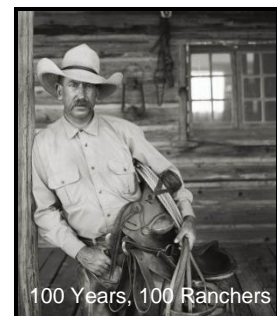


Bisbee Council on the Arts and Humanities, BISBEE. *Cochise County History on the Move: Coming Face to Face with History.* AHC funds will support a local history project documenting and celebrating the stories of those who have made an impact on the development of Cochise County. Project includes the development of a traveling exhibit, a companion booklet, and interactive website. \$10,000

Braun Sacred Heart Center, PHOENIX. *Arizona's Mexican Heritage: An American Story.* AHC funds will support costs related to the production of a four-part video documentary on the origins, integration and contributions of Arizona's Hispanic population. Grant funds will specifically cover research, video consultants and DVD preparation and distribution. \$10,000

City of Chandler, CHANDLER. *N.J. Harris/Kesler Neighborhood History Project.* The City of Chandler's Human Relations will produce a publication documenting the daily life and culture of the historic N.J. Harris-Kesler neighborhood. AHC funds will support promotional costs, printing for 1,500 free books, and salary/honoraria for participating humanities scholars. \$10,000

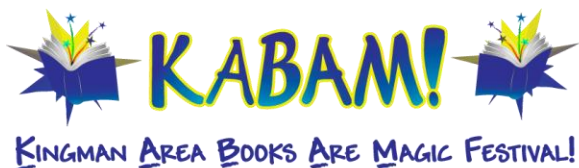
Desert Caballeros Western Museum, WICKENBURG. *100 Years, 100 Ranchers.* An exhibit and accompanying audio guide using photographs of contemporary ranchers. The exhibit will open in May 2012, and will run through October 2012. \$4,800



The Loft Cinema, TUCSON. *Human Rights Watch Film Festival.* Ten public screenings and discussions of films exploring global human rights issues, beginning in the Spring 2012. \$10,000

Maricopa Community College District, KBAQ FM, TEMPE. *Hearing the Century: Voices from Arizona's Past and Present.* Production of twenty radio segments exploring the life and times of lesser known artistic contributions to Arizona of the past century. Radio segments will be aired on Rio Salado's KBAQ FM station through February 2012. \$5,000

Mesa Media, Inc., POLACCA. *Hopi Perspectives on Hopihiniwtipu (Hopi History).* AHC funds will support the second phase of a two-phase oral history documentation project compiling and interpreting oral histories from Hopi elders on the history of the Hopi language, distributed through the production and printing of a booklet, CD-set, and Web content available in June 2012. \$5,500



Mohave Library Alliance, KINGMAN. *KABAM! Kingman Area Books Are Magical Festival.* AHC funds will support costs associated with humanities presentations and workshops at the KABAM! public book festival in Kingman in May 2011. \$10,000

Museum of Northern Arizona, FLAGSTAFF. *"Heritage Insights" Programming at the 2011 Hopi and Navajo Festivals of Arts and Culture.* AHC funds will support humanities programming during the Museum of Northern Arizona's 78th Hopi Festival of Arts and Culture in July 2011, and the 62nd annual Navajo Festival of Arts and Culture in August, 2011. \$5,500



Papago Salado Association, PHOENIX. *The Stories of Place.* AHC funds will support the first phase of this oral-history project, including the initial research and creation of the audio scripts and interpretative materials. \$10,000



Pascua Yaqui Tribe, TUCSON. *In Maala Tehwak- My Mother Told Me.* An oral history project focused on collecting oral histories of tribal women through three community history and discussion programs. \$5,000

Phoenix College, PHOENIX. *2011 Phoenix College Latino Film Festival.* AHC funds will support the 2011 Phoenix College Latino Film Festival, hosted at the Burton Barr Public Library and the Arizona Latino Cultural Center Galeria in April 2011. \$5,000

Sabores Sin Fronteras, TUCSON. *Arizona Heritage Food Wagon.* AHC funds will support an interactive, mobile exhibit in the form of a "food wagon" exploring heritage food and food history in Arizona. As part of the content of the "food wagon," humanities scholars will present on a variety of topics related to food history and multicultural heritage foods. \$10,000

Tucson Chinese Association, TUCSON. *Second Annual Chinese Immigrant History Symposium.* AHC funds will support a public symposium in September 2011, including an exhibit titled "The Vanishing Chinese Grocery Store," and programming exploring the role of food in early Chinese communities in Arizona. \$5,000

Tucson Museum of Art, TUCSON. *Pre-Columbian Art, an online catalog.* The publication of the museum's online catalogue, featuring a collection of Pre-Columbian Art. Visitors to the TMA's website will be able to access the online catalog, including essays and commentary by humanities scholars, for free beginning April 2012. \$8,449



Friday at the Fort

Tucson Presidio Trust for Historic Preservation, TUCSON. *Friday at the Fort.* AHC funds will support K-12 visits at the Old Pueblo at the recreated Spanish Fort of Tucson throughout 2011. Students will explore the lives of early Spanish Colonial settlers through interactive displays and hands-on activities that promote and encourage critical thinking and further exploration of this period. \$5,000

University of Arizona, TUCSON. *UA Reads: A Common Reading Program.* AHC funds will support a community reading project, including author discussions, lectures, multimedia presentations, film screenings and exhibits throughout 2011. \$5,000

University of Arizona, Arizona State Museum, TUCSON. *Through the Eyes of the Eagle: Illustrating Healthy Living.* AHC funds will support humanities interpretation and programming to "Through the Eyes of the Eagle: Illustrating Healthy Living," a traveling exhibit exploring the history of diabetes awareness and prevention through Native American perspectives on eating and culture. \$9,700



University of Arizona, Arizona State Museum, TUCSON. *Basketry Treasured, an exhibit.* AHC funds will support the development of an exhibit exploring the museum's world-renowned collection of Native American basketry. The exhibit will open in April, 2012, and will include public lectures, docent training programs, and weaving demonstrations and lectures. \$10,000



University of Arizona, Center for Latin American Studies, TUCSON. *The Borderlands Film Series: Historical & Contemporary Immigration Issues.* AHC funds will support a nine-month screening and discussion program series featuring eight documentaries and dramas beginning in September 2011. The series, which will be free and hosted by Tucson-area Harkins theaters, explore the experiences of undocumented workers and their families in the U.S. \$5,000

Yuma County Library District, YUMA. *Authors Across America.* The Yuma County Library District, in collaboration with San Luis High School, will launch Phase II of "Authors Across America," a reading and discussion program series featuring three monthly online Skype book discussions between authors and teens at the San Luis Library Branch. Programs being in September 2011, and continue through Dec 2011. \$2,045

Sahuaro Ranch Park Historic Area, GLENDALE. *Sahuaro Ranch Park History Podcast Tour.* AHC funds will support the development of a podcast tour complementing a reinstallation of the Ranch's outdoor exhibits of the Sahuaro Ranch Park Historic Area, a 17-acre ranching complex dating to 1886. AHC funds will support historical research as well as podcast production. \$10,000

American Society for Environmental History, PHOENIX. *Public Discussion on Immigration, Borderlands and the Environment.* AHC funds will support a panel discussion and public forum around immigration and U.S.-Mexico border relations in April 2011. \$1,000

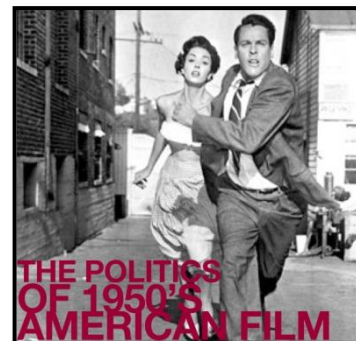

The workshop will include presentations by humanities scholars, a facilitated book discussion of "The Devil's Highway," and a film screening and discussion of the documentary "Crossing Arizona." Workshops and exhibit will be free and open to the general public. \$1,000

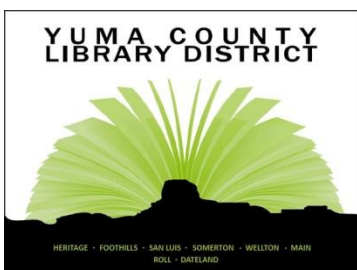
